Transatlantic Civil Society in Periodicals, 1768-1925 contains a series of journals, magazines, and trade papers published on either side of the Atlantic during the 18th, 19th, and 20th centuries.

This period encompasses war, peace, and everything in-between, from the Boston Tea Party through the Emancipation Proclamation to the First World War.



The collection is part of British Online Archives' American Studies series.

The periodicals are diverse in nature, but their focus is on social, cultural, and economic interchange between North America and Europe, with an emphasis on Anglo-American relations.
