WORLD NEWS IN INDIAN NEWSPAPERS, 1782-1908

Part of our wide-ranging [Power and Preachers](#) series, this collection contains copies of three English language newspapers published in India during the period 1782-1908: **The India Gazette** (1782-1834); **The Bengal Hurkaru and Chronicle** (1822-1866); and **The Bengal Times** (1876-1908).

These newspapers were primarily sold to colonial businessmen, merchants, and administrators with an interest in regional and international trade.

Editors and reporters therefore focussed on providing readers with an overview of significant political, military, economic, scientific, and societal trends, as well as their potential impact on stocks, commodities, and other investments.

Subjects covered range from the American Revolution and the Crimean War to British parliamentary debates on the India Act of 1858 and the dramatic industrial and pharmaceutical breakthroughs of the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

India, England, France, Ireland, Italy, the United States, and China receive the most attention, though items regarding other nations also feature.
