Science and Marxism, 1956-1985 contains records compiled by William Wainright and the various departments he was part of during his long career with the CPGB.

These records include minutes. circulars, and reports from various events and bodies that were concerned with science and its implications for socialism.



The collection is part of the wide-ranging British Communism, At Home and Abroad series.



It encompasses more than 3,700 unique images.

Wainwright amassed many files from the influential roles he undertook, including being on the Science and Technology Sub-Committee and being heavily involved with the publication of the party newspaper, the Morning Star.

He was close to General Secretary John Gollan, and served as assistant secretary after his rise to power in 1956.

Overall, this collection offers us a unique insight into the scientific considerations of the CPGB, which saw socialist revolution as predicated on the scientific theory on human development, historical materialism.
