

Explore communism through the lens of...

British Online Archives' updated collection, Communism and Popular Culture in the 20th century, 1911-1988, sheds light on the cultural politics of sport, cinema, and the arts through one of the Communist Party of Great Britain's (CPGB) busiest figures, Ivor Montagu (1904-1984).

Montagu was best known for his work as a filmmaker, scriptwriter, and producer.



This collection is part of the *British*Communism at Home and Abroad,
1883-1991 series.

He was also a trained naturalist, the founder of the International Table Tennis Federation, president of the Southampton F.C. Supporters' Club, and a prominent communist activist.

The collection draws from Montagu's extensive personal papers, which offer a detailed and often intimate portrait of Montagu's busy life, from his childhood in elite education to his numerous political activities with the CPGB.

The collection contains over 25,000 unique images.




Montagu's papers therefore provide a unique insight into the interaction between communism and popular culture during the 20th century.
