

## Delve into the lives of activists...


British Online Archives updated collection, *Notable Individuals of British Communism, 1886-1997*, contains papers related to the many activists and sympathisers that dedicated their lives to the struggle for revolutionary socialism in Britain.

Largely derived from the Communist Party of Great Britain's (CPGB) most committed activists, including full-time "national" and "district" organisers, this collection also contains the personal

papers of peripheral figures who were sympathetic to the communist cause. These include Labour MPs, authors and playwrights in creative industries, as well as trade unionists fighting bosses for better working conditions.



The collection contains over 23,500 unique images.

A host of autobiographical material offers an interesting blend of both personal and historical events through the prism of communist activism.

This includes the political radicalisation that led many activists to join the CPGB, anti-imperialist activism in the face of the British Empire, and the militancy of anti-fascist activism in the Spanish Civil War and Second World War.


## What is the Socialist League?

The early splintered communist movement of the nineteenth century crystallised into the centralised Marxist-Leninist Communist Party of Great Britain in 1920 after a "Unity Conference" of groups on the British left.



The collection details the work of the National Minority Movement, as well as the South Wales Miners' Federation, and the Amalgamated Engineering Union.



The collection covers Cold War flashpoints, such as 1960 U-2 incident, and the eventual collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991.

Over 4 million records covering 1000 years of world history: from politics & warfare, to slavery & revolution.
